If you will be out of town on Election Day, November 5th, or you are over 65 and just don't want to walk the candidate gauntlet for in-person voting, you can request a mail in ballot as long as you do it by October 25th. Advocacy for our brothers and sisters in the Active, Reserve and Guard

As most of you know, our military forces are facing the greatest recruiting challenges since the start of the All Volunteer Force. The Department of Defense has realized that our current members are vastly different in terms of financial and familial needs and their work/home balance values. In order to encourage Congressional support to meet the needs of the new force demographics, MOAA works with the DoD Defense-State Liaison Office (DSLO) to identify issues important to military families so that we can advocate for effective policies at the federal and state levels. I have worked with the DSLO since 2021 to advocate for many of these priorities and will continue to ask for your "voice" (advocacy emails). Our nation's existence depends, in large part, on a strong and fully resourced military. Helping to bolster readiness (by meeting recruiting and retention objectives) is a great way for all of us to "continue to serve".

Greetings from the finance department. Leaves are falling and the grass isn't growing so fast (though the fall weeds are making up for it). I've been scratching my head trying to figure out where all the grey hairs on my shoulder are coming from and to find something for this month's newsletter. Something you haven't heard before maybe. Well, first, here is something you have heard before. It is called a plea. A plea to our wonderful members to bring their membership dues in the chapter up to date. It is a great month (while you still have some money in the account before the holidays) to pay your \$25 dues for calendar year 2024. Also don't forget our very long-standing and kindhearted tradition which allows you to pay a discounted amount of \$20 if paid early (by 31Dec) for your next year's 2025 membership dues and be automatically entered into our mega-millions raffle held in January. The grand prize being a free, one year, all dues expense paid membership in our great chapter in 2026. I know, truly amazing. Our chapter account bank balance is \$15,380 as of 8Oct. It is worth noting that in the 5 years I have been helping with the books, our operating balance, after funding the scholarships awarded each year, has remained very stable. This speaks well for the former and current board members' management of the chapter. I would love to see some of our chapter members who haven't yet, volunteer to serve on the board. One zoom meeting a month and maybe help with the luncheons and dinner planning. That's about it. Please consider lending a hand.

A Thought from Chaplain (Colonel) Paul Vicalvi, U.S Army Retired




